We had to go right by the smelly pig lot. Homer got his small pony and led it to this small structures that the pigs lounged under at times. He led the pony over to me and said, "I'm going to get on top of this hog barn. You slap the pony on its rear to make him come under it. Slap him hard so he will run. Then I will jump on him when he comes out." The little shed wasn't about 8 feet long. Homer got in place on the other end. I slapped the pony's behind. He went under the shed and I saw Homer leap! By me he went squealing just like the big hog he was riding! Right up the hill they both went, and from the corner of my eye I saw my grandmother running across the bridge yelling, "Get off my hog! You're gonna break her down!" She made it to my side in mere seconds. The hog came downhill still enraged. She reached out and jerked Homer from her beloved hog. The look of terror on hog's and rider's face matched the terror in her voice. My grandmother swatted Homer on the butt and asked him why he was riding her hog? He said, "Because my pony scared the stupid hog out from the shed. Where is my pony?" She said, "If you hurt my hog, I'm selling the pony to buy anuthern." He looked right at her and said, I ain't never seen anuthern. How many legs they got?" He got swatted again and sent across the bridge. Not long ago, he asked if I remembered his little pony. I told him it was one of my fondest memories of him. That memory is burned into my brain and of the night when I was ten and we made prank phone calls. He would tell me what to say. I apologize to anyone out there who was on the other end of the line. And Homer, as I ended our phone calls: Bye Home. Love you.

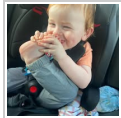
